Come Lord Jesus and bring joy and laughter among us. Come with , the music of eternity and the songs of the earth. Come among us and make us truly grateful for your birth and your love.

Christmas Newsletter 2024 Let Peace Flourish


There is something very special about this time of year. It stirs up in us something very deep inside us. Despite all the problems of our world, we are brought back to the things
