Gospel Reflections A Series of Contrasts Donal Neary SJ

The gospel is a series of contrasts – rich andpoor, greedy and generous, arrogant and humble and it is not difficult to guess which of them Jesus is praising. The lady in question, a poor widow, may not even have heard the praise of Jesus but the disciples were left in no doubt where Jesus' sympathies lay.

He praises true religion in the widow who gave all she had in the cause of God. He berates the co-existence of long prayers and the greed which took away the property of people like this widow. The religious people of the day were meant to look after the widow and the orphan who had nobody else to fight their cause.

From the gospel we take the invitation of Jesus to give all; the amount given is not the big question, it is the giving of the heart. Jesus knows the listeners would cop on that what he was talking about was more than money – it was to give the first place in life to God and the things of God. That is the call to all of us.

The things of God we can glibly refer to are the love we are called to receive and to give, it is to care for other things of God too like creation, justice, peace and reconciliation. It is to give time to worship God in common and in private – to ensure a space and time for prayer in each day.

The widow of the gospel had a generous heart, as did the widow in the first reading. They looked outward to the needs of other and the things of God, and gave what they could in this direction. Can we not do the same?





Christmas Care for Ukrainian Orphans:

BRING JOY AFTER LOSS ...

Hello everyone I am reaching out to you for help, specifically with «Bring Joy after Loss.» This concerns children who, as a result of the full-scale war that has been ongoing for almost three years in Ukraine, have lost their parents, childhood, sense of safety, and joy. Due to the ongoing war, 13,000 children have lost parental care, with 1,759 of these children officially recognized as orphans in Ukraine. Since the onset of the war, I have been dedicated to supporting orphans in Ukraine. In the early weeks of the conflict, with the support of my family and the generous contributions of kind-hearted individuals, I raised €40,000. These funds were used to renovate the basement of a Ukrainian orphanage providing a safer space for the children. Two years ago, thanks to the incredible generosity of the residents of Wicklow Town and your parish in particular, I was able to raise around €8,000. This allowed us to purchase 1,000 new toys, bringing moments of joy to 1,000 Ukrainian children living in shelters and orphanages across the country. As a mother of three, I understand just how special Christmas is for children. And for us, as adults, it's important to make this time magical for them no matter what! It's incredibly difficult for me to accept that while my children may have more than they need, there are others who won't even receive a hug on Christmas morning, let alone a gift. That's why I believe in your understanding, compassion, love, and kindness—your ability to help me make a difference and bring joy after loss. «There is no such thing as someone else's child. All donations received will be directed toward purchasing Christmas toys for Ukrainian children who have lost their parents due to the war. Many thanks from the bottom of my heart.


